

Timeline of the Kingdoms of Israel and Judah




After Solomon, the kingdom was divided into TWO parts:

THE NORTHERN KINGDOM

under King Jeroboam. Its capital was located in Samaria. This kingdom is called the <u>kingdom of ISRAEL</u>.

THE SOUTHERN KINGDOM

under King Rehoboam (Solomon's son). Its capital was located in Jerusalem. This kingdom is called the <u>kingdom of JUDAH</u>. All the kings of Judah descended from King David.








1 Kings 1: Adonijah






1 Kings 3: Wisdom Given to Solomon




1 Kings 4: Solomon's Administration

Deut 17:16-17

But he shall not multiply horses for himself, nor cause the people to return to Egypt to multiply horses, for the Lord has said to you, 'You shall not return that way again.' Neither shall he multiply wives for himself, lest his heart turn away; nor shall he greatly multiply silver and **gold** for himself.

1 Kings 11: Solomon's Downfall

- Solomon's downfall came in his old age
- He had taken many foreign wives, whom he allowed to worship other gods. He even built shrines for the sacrifices of his foreign wives.
- For this apostasy, God told Solomon he had decided to remove him from being king. Yet out of respect for Solomon's father, faithful King David, he would not do this during Solomon's lifetime, nor would he remove him completely — Solomon's heir would retain a small portion of the kingdom.
- The prophet Ahijah of Shiloh prophesied that Jeroboam son of Nebat would become king over ten of the 12 tribes, instead of one of Solomon's sons.

"Their sons and their daughters . . . they sacrificed to the idols of Canaan"

Now the LORD raised up an adversary against Solomon..

11:14 ...Hadad the Edomite
11:23 And God raised up *another* adversary against him, Rezon the son of Eliadah
11:26 Then Solomon's servant, Jeroboam the son of Nebat, an Ephraimite from Zereda ...also rebelled against the king.






Jezebel is an avid Baal worshiper from Sidon, a city far to the north of Israel.

> Jeroboam's two golden calf gods have shrines in Bethel & Dan


Ahab lives in Samaria, the capital of Israel. There he builds a temple to Baal and sets up a pole to worship Asherah.








1 Kings 14: Judgment Jeroboam's House


